



Students are whole beings, growing academically, physically, socially, and emotionally. The more educators focus on the whole child, the more children learn and the healthier they will be. For this reason, in 2015 and continuing through 2017, Belmont launched a district-wide social-emotional learning (SEL) effort to enhance all aspects of the Belmont Public Schools.

The FBE fully funded Belmont's Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) program. By funding professional development, facilitation work, resource books, and presentations to educators and community members, the FBE enabled the school district to support social and emotional learning at all grade levels.

To date, the district has made significant steps in creating a long-term, sustainable infrastructure to support all students' social and emotional learning. A SEL Steering Committee has been established in each school, and committee members have received training to design and lead professional learning experiences for all of Belmont Public School's educators and staff. In addition, many parents participated in SEL workshops held throughout the year and have been able to incorporate SEL-related skills in helping their children outside of school.
